Terms of Reference

Animal Welfare and Ethical Review Body

Scope:

- advise the University on compliance with the Animal (Scientific Procedures) Act 1986 (as amended);
- promote awareness of animal welfare and the 3Rs;
- provide a forum for discussion and development of ethical advice to the establishment licence holder on all matters related to animal welfare, care and use at the establishment;
- support named persons and other staff dealing with animals, on animal welfare, ethical issues and provision of appropriate training;
- help to promote a 'culture of care' within the establishment and, as appropriate, in the wider community.

- to ensure the adequacy of animal care and animal accommodation in relation to ea licensed procedure;
- to ensure that staff working with animals are aware of the availability of informatior relating to alternatives to the use of animals;
- to ensure that all staff involved in animal work are appropriately trained and are competent in the care and management of animals to encourage a culture of care;
- to ensure that all persons involved in ASPA licenced work are kept informed of technical and scientific developments that supports the 3Rs;

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
